Multilingual Communication: Early childhood educators consistently identify the language preferences of families and offer multilingual communication. For example, the team ensures that important notices, newsletters, and communication materials are available in languages spoken by the diverse families in the centre.

Cultural Celebrations: Educators regularly identify cultural events and celebrations of the children and families attending the centre. They implement culturally sensitive practices by incorporating these celebrations into the curriculum, allowing children to share their cultural traditions, and inviting families to participate.

Cultural Competence Training: The early childhood education team participates in ongoing cultural competence training to consistently identify and understand the cultural backgrounds and values of the families. They use this knowledge to adapt their teaching methods and interactions, promoting cultural sensitivity and respect.

Community Partnerships: The team actively identifies and collaborates with community organisations or leaders representing different cultural groups. This allows them to access cultural resources, gain insights, and engage in culturally sensitive activities or events that benefit both the children and their families.

Flexible Parent-Educator Meetings: Educators consistently identify the varying schedules and preferences of parents when it comes to parent-teacher meetings. They implement flexibility by offering options for virtual meetings, alternative meeting times, or family conferences held in community spaces that are more accessible and comfortable for parents from different backgrounds.
