Exceeding – Family and Community Links.

How <u>your understanding</u> of the <u>cultural and</u> <u>community context</u> refers to the knowledge and awareness that early childhood educators have of the cultural and community context in which their centre is located. This involves understanding the cultural norms, values, and practices of the families and communities they serve, as well as the social and economic factors that may impact children's learning and development.

Support families' parenting and wellbeing needs means providing families with the resources, tools, and support they need to ensure their children's healthy development and wellbeing. This can include information and resources on positive parenting practices, child development, and early learning, as well as support for families' mental health and wellbeing. By supporting families in these areas, early childhood educators can help parents and caregivers feel confident and capable in their parenting roles, which can have positive impacts on children's development and overall family wellbeing.

Now that we have examined the words in detail, we can start exploring what these concepts could look like for you. It is important to ensure that we make it very clear

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how these three concepts have **created change** in your service.

We are an early childhood centre located in a **culturally diverse community** where many families speak languages other than English at home. The educators in our centre have a deep understanding of the community's **cultural and linguistic diversity** and recognise that families **may need additional support** in navigating the early childhood education system.

To support families' parenting and wellbeing needs, educators provide translated materials, such as brochures and information sheets, in the families' home languages. We also use our multilingual educators or interpreters to facilitate communication with families who have limited English.

We hold workshops or information sessions for families on topics such as positive parenting practices, child development, and early learning, in a culturally sensitive and appropriate manner. We invite guest speakers or community leaders who share the families' cultural backgrounds to facilitate these workshops and help establish a sense of cultural connection and belonging.
